

Presentation Secondary School Waterford

The aim of this Acceptable Use Policy is to ensure that pupils will benefit from learning opportunities offered by the school's Internet resources in a safe and effective manner. Internet use and access is considered a school resource and privilege. Therefore, if the school AUP is not adhered to this privilege will be withdrawn and appropriate sanctions – as outlined in the Code of Behaviour – will be imposed.

School's Strategy

The school employs a number of strategies in order to maximise learning opportunities and reduce risks associated with the Internet. These strategies are as follows:

General

- Internet sessions will always be supervised by a member of school staff.
- Filtering software and/or equivalent systems will be used in order to minimise the risk of exposure to inappropriate material.
- The school will regularly monitor pupils' Internet usage.
- Students and teachers will be provided with training in the area of Internet safety.
- Uploading and downloading of non-approved software will not be permitted.
- Virus protection software will be used and updated on a regular basis.
- The use of memory sticks, CD-ROMs, or other digital storage media in school requires a teacher's permission and will be phased out, with cloud computing solutions being used instead.
- Students will treat others with respect at all times and will not undertake any actions that may bring the school into disrepute.
- Internet may only be accessed via the school server during school hours.

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World Wide Web

- Students will not intentionally visit Internet sites that contain obscene pornographic, offensive, abusive, racist, libelous, defamatory, threatening, illegal, hateful or otherwise objectionable materials.
- Students will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in accordance with school procedures.
- Students will use the Internet for educational purposes only.
- Students will not copy information into assignments and fail to acknowledge the source (plagiarism and copyright infringement).
- Students will never disclose or publicise personal information.
- Downloading materials or images not relevant to their studies, is in direct breach of the school's acceptable use policy.
- Students will be aware that any usage, including distributing or receiving information, school-related or personal, may be monitored for unusual activity, security and/or network management reasons.

Email

- Students will communicate through approved school email accounts under supervision by or with permission from a teacher.
- Students will not send or receive any material that is illegal, obscene, defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.
- Students will not reveal their own or other people's personal details, such as addresses or telephone numbers or pictures.
- Students will never arrange a face-to-face meeting with someone they only know through emails or the internet.
- Students will note that sending and receiving email attachments is subject to permission from their teacher.
- **Internet Chat**
- Students will not have access to chat rooms, discussion forums, messaging or other electronic communication fora in the school.

School Website

- Pupils will be given the opportunity to publish projects, artwork or school work on the World Wide Web in accordance with clear policies and approval processes regarding the content that can be loaded to the school's website
- The website will be regularly checked to ensure that there is no content that compromises the safety of pupils or staff.
- Website using facilities such as guest books, noticeboards or weblogs will be checked frequently to ensure that they do not contain personal details.
- The publication of student work will be co-ordinated by a teacher.
- Pupils' work will appear in an educational context on Web pages with a copyright notice prohibiting the copying of such work without express written permission.
- The school will endeavour to use digital photographs, audio or video clips focusing on group activities. Content focusing on individual students will not

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be published on the school website with out the parental permission. Video clips may be password protected.

- Personal pupil information including home address and contact details will be omitted from school web pages.
- The school website, where possible, will avoid publishing the first name and last name of individuals in a photograph.
- The school will ensure that the image files are appropriately named – will not use pupils' names in image file names or ALT tags if published on the web.
- Staff and Pupils will continue to own the copyright on any work published.

Personal Devices

Pupils using their own technology in school and on school related activities may only do so under the supervision of a teacher, or with permission from a teacher. Images and text may be used for educational purposes only, **and may not be posted on social network sites.**

Support Structures

Sanctions

Misuse of the Internet may result in disciplinary action in accordance with the school's Code of Behaviour. The school also reserves the right to report any illegal activities to the appropriate authorities.

This policy should be read in conjunction with the school's Code of Behaviour and Mobile Phone Policy.

This policy will be reviewed annually or as required.
